Lord Molyneaux held many offices within the Royal Black Institution and was the Sovereign Grand Master from June 1971 to December 1998.

"He was a quiet unassuming man of immense integrity and he had a lovely way with people, from all walks of life. The word that dominated his life was service, whether it was in the RAF, the political field or the loyal orders. He was a true gentleman who inspired others and he will be very sadly missed by every-one who had the pleasure of

knowing him, and particularly the Sir Knights in the Institution."

The Grand Master of the Grand Orange Lodge of Ireland, Edward Stevenson, said, "Lord Molyneaux always epitomized the principles of the Institution and exercised very strong and steady leadership throughout the worst of the

IRA's terrorist campaign. There is no doubt that, but for his responsible leadership of the unionist community during that period, Northern Ireland could have experienced even greater violence."

There were tributes to the former Ulster Unionist leader and MP from right across the political spectrum.

His political career spanned more than three decades.

James Molyneaux joined the Ulster Unionist Party in 1946 and went on to become one of its longest-serving leaders from 1979 to 1995.

At the end of World War Two, he was among the first British troops to enter the newly liberated Belsen concentration camp in Germany.

He was knighted in 1996 and was granted a life peerage in the 1997 Birthday Honours list, becoming Lord Molyneaux of Killead.

There will be five demonstrations on the Last Saturday in August.





Chairs presented in memory of Sir Knight McKelvey

he late Rt. Wor. Sir Knight and Bro Robert S McKelvey MBE PCGM (pictured) was remembered at Upper Crossgare Orange hall when his widow, Edna, and family presented two chairs in his memory - one to LOL 1608 and the other to RBP 619.



per Crossgare and Sir Knight McKelvey was one of 19 members to be initiated at their first meeting held on 15th February, 1948.

During his 60 years of service he was to become a stalwart of the institutions being elected as District Master of both orders before serving a term as County Grand Master, County Down Royal Black Chapter, from 2003 to 2005.

While an active member of both institutions it was his love and dedication to lecturing for which he will be best remembered.

On 1st March, 1950, at the age of 19, he was awarded his lecturing certificate from the IGBCBC .Following a term as 1st District Lecturer he was then elected to 1st County lecturer, a post he was to hold for 20 years, before being appointed to the Irish examining board of lecturers, where he served until his death in 2008.

Although very busy with both Loyal Orders he found the time to serve his community as a 'B' Special and member of the UDR, where he was commissioned from the ranks to retire at the rank of Captain, having been awarded the MBE in 1990 for

his service.

The chairs which were made by Bro Geoffrey Brown of Classic Joinery, based in Castlewellan, and were dedicated by the Rev David Hyndman of Magherahamlet Presbyterian Church, where Robert was a member of the committee.

The event was attended by many distinguished Sir Knights and Brethren, not only from the county but across the province, which was a token of the high esteem in which Sir Knight McKelvey was held.

Among those in attendance were the Sovereign Grand Master Millar Far and Bro Harold Henning, Assistant Grand Master GOLI, both of whom addressed the service and spoke fondly of their memories of Sir Knight McKelyev.

The event was coordinated by Wor Sir Knight and Bro Herbert Chambers PM, who spoke on behalf of LOL1608 and RBP 619.

Following the service tea was served in Magherahamlet Church Hall where the County Grand Master, Trevor Hawthorne and Rt Wor Sir Knight George Arthur, Ballymena District, were among those who spoke and thanked the family.

Cyril Wilson, RBP 1168 – Carricklongfield, Killyman – looks back on how the support of the Royal Black Institution makes a difference in Uganda...

Making a difference in Af

Three years ago the Imperial Grand Black Chapter wealth supported Kiwoko Hos- wards. pital in Uganda as their designated charity.

Along with fundraising they sent a team of 16 men out to Kiwoko Hospital to support the Ugandan builders as they built accommodation for doctors. That accommodation had two bungalows and, at a later date, a third bungalow was added to it.

I was one of those men. This was my first time on a mission trip and I had never thought I would ever go on a trip such as this. We had a fantastic time at Kiwoko, some of us building, doing electric work, helping in the garage and myself going around the wards with the Chaplain of the Hospital talking to and praying with the patients.

The Rev Andrew Forster of St Ann's Church of Ireland in Dungannon told us that Uganda would get in our blood. I know, for me, his words were true. I became friends with the Chaplain of the hospital, Rev Michael Mwandha, and his family.

This August past was the first time since I became a Knight of the Red Cross that I did not attend the Last Saturday.

On the Thursday before, I left Northern Ireland with another group to go back to Uganda on another Mission Trip. We went with a group from Bangor called Abaana (children in Lugandan language) who have a New Life Home for boys.

These boys are from the streets of Kampala and they can of the British Common- range from the age of seven up-


> They have left their homes for various reasons, thinking Kampala will be a better life. When they get there, they find the truth. They live on the streets, sleeping where ever they can and eating whenever they can.

> This was very challenging to see the Lord at work in the lives of these boys and especially the volunteers in Uganda who look after these boys with limited resources.

> Abaana also have schools in Uganda, Matthew Cardwell, Strathearn Primary School, that have a connection to Northern Ireland to name a few. At the schools, I had the opportunity to speak to the boys and girls about our Lord Jesus Christ, using the Wordless Book and to then help them make a wrist band with the colours of the Wordless Book in beads so they could remember the truths of God's Word.

> It has been a very exciting but challenging time in Uganda, both this year and three years ago. It has opened my eyes to see the Lord at work here and Uganda, He is the same God no matter where we are in the world. DV I will go back again in a few

Boomhill RBP 1147 celebrated 90 years on the road with a number of events throughout the past year.

The first event was a special meeting of the preceptory held on Wednesday 25th June, 2014, exactly 90 years to the day of the very first meeting of RBP 1147. The Worshipful Master, Worshipful Brother Paul Robinson, opened the meeting in the presence of many dignitaries, including Most Worshipful Sir Knight Millar Farr, SGM.

During this meeting a Red Cross and Certificate was presented to a Sir Knight, and other Sir Knights received 40 year jewels, 50 year and 60 year bars respectively.

A very successful BBQ and concert was held on 27th June and featured Bloomhill Accordion Band, the band which leads the Preceptory, 'The 1147ers' (easy listening music group), and the 'Men in Black' choir accompanied by Carla Sinnamon.

The 'Men in Black' are all members of RBP 1147 and 'The 1147ers' are either members of RBP 1147 or of Bloomhill Accordion Band. This event saw the hall filled to capacity, and the Sir Knights even had to set up tables outside to cater for those present.

A Banner Service was held

on 26th October at which the Sir Knight Rev William Anderson outlined the Biblical meanings of the symbols on both the old and current banner of RBP 1147.

This service was preceded by a token re-enactment of the first parade ever made by RBP 1147. In 1924, the Preceptory consisted of 15 members and, being led by two pipers, paraded from Stughan Orange Hall to the main Black Saturday demonstration in Cookstown, paraded back to Bloomhill House - where the members were treated to a meal by the Kinley family and then paraded to Stughan Hall again where a dance was held to finish off the day in style.

On a cold and wet October evening in 2014, the preceptory did not re-enact the 1924 activity in full but did carry out a short parade to Stughan Hall led by two pipers. In addition, the Past Master of Bloomhill RBP 1147, Sir Knight Drew Robinson, wore a sash that was over 100 years old (kindly on loan from the Wilson family of Blacktown). This sash belonged to a relative of the Wilson family who was a member of Sherrygroom RBP 338.

The Sherrygroom Preceptory no longer exists but some of its members, including Sir Knight Thomas John Robinson, were the founding members of Bloomhill Bloomhill RBP 1147

In 1924, Sir Knight Thomas John Robinson became the first WM of RBP 1147 and he was the grandfather of the immediate Past Master, Sir Knight Drew Robinson, and a great grandfather of the current WM, Sir Knight Paul Robinson.

After a busy 90th anniversary

year, the preceptory continues to flourish, having added a further seven Sir Knights to the roll book. The future looks very bright for Bloomhill Olive Branch of Peace RBP 1147. The preceptory would like to take this opportunity to thank all those throughout 2014 that made their anniversary year a resounding success.

Honorary Sir Knight Kenneth Wilson

loomhill Olive Branch of Peace RBP 1147 has recognised the commitment of its Preceptory Chaplain.

On Wednesday 4th March, 2015, after 46 years of faithful service, attendance at meetings and the reading of God's Word from Holy Scripture, Honorary Sir Knight Kenneth Wilson stood down as Preceptory Chaplain.

Sir Knight Kenneth, or Kenny as he is known locally, joined Bloomhill Olive Branch of Peace RBP 1147, encamped at Stughan on 1st August, 1956. After being a member for 13 years, he was elected to the role of Chaplain on 5th July, 1969, taking over from his uncle. It was in this role Sir Knight Kenny would remain for the next 46 years until unto 4th March, 2015, one year short of him amassing an incredible 60 years' faithful and devoted service to the Royal Black Institution. Indeed, during Sir Knight Kenny's 46 years as Chaplain he has served under no less than eight Worshipful Masters.

Sir Knight Kenny is one life's true gentleman and someone who has devoted his entire life to God and living by his example. This is very much relevant in his everyday life, but more so when he was Chaplain. His delivery of God's word and the summary of Scriptures when a degree was being conferred were so sincere. The way in which Sir Knight Kenny delivered the Word of God challenged us all to refocus our lives, to listen and to apply it to our lives.

All the Sir Knights at Bloomhill are sad to see Sir Knight Kenny step down as Chaplain. We do wish his wife Sadie, who has be a strong support to him now for many years, and Sir Knight Kenneth, God's richest blessings, best wishes and good health for the many years that lie ahead.



Sir Knight George Savage

The Institution expresses sympathy to the family of George Savage, who died in the autumn.

Concerned about your spiritual health?

Reflections by Rev. Nigel Kane

e're all familiar with sickness, whether it's as insignificant as the common cold, or as serious as a life-threatening illness.

Sickness of any kind isn't pleasant because it's part of the curse that came into the world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God. When Jesus was on earth, He performed healing miracles which temporarily reversed the effects of the Fall.

One such miracle is found in Mark 1:40-45. We read that "A man with leprosy came to [Jesus] and begged Him on his knees, 'If you are willing, you can make me clean" (v.40).

Leprosy is a skin disease which destroys nerves, bringing numbness to extremities. The devastation that follows comes from unknowingly damaging body parts, and infection setting in.

Lepers only had to look at their infected hands, or feet, to be reminded about the seriousness of their condition. If that wasn't misery enough, in Bible times, lepers were considered ceremonially un-

clean, and excluded from society until they were cured.

The consequences of this terrible disease caused the man to disregard these rules and come to Jesus, begging for cleansing. Notice that, although this leper realised that Jesus was perfectly able to heal Him, He also recognised that he had no right to presume that Jesus would heal him. This is the correct attitude with which to approach God when we're ill, or we're praying for someone else who's ill.

Mark says that Jesus was so "Filled with compassion" (v.41) for this leper that He reached out His hand, and said, "I am willing. Be clean!"

A leper wasn't allowed to touch anyone, and no-one touched a leper, to avoid ceremonial uncleanness. Jesus' compassion for this man didn't let this stop Him from touching this man. Mark continues, "Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cured" (v.42). The leper was healed instantly and completely.

Throughout Scripture, leprosy is a picture of sin, so the healing of leprosy symbolises deliverance from sin. Sin, like leprosy, starts off

small, numbing our sense of right and wrong, causing us to do things which harm our soul, and sometimes our body also. Sin progresses steadily to affect ever more parts of our life. We can even reach a stage where it doesn't even bother us when we sin.

Whether we like to admit it, or not, we're all spiritual lepers. Have you seen the uncleanness of sin within your life? Or, are you convincing yourself that you're OK?

Only those who accept that they're ill will seek medical help. Similarly, only those who accept that they're a sinner and who is powerless to deal with their sin by themselves, will seek God's forgiveness.

There's a fundamental difference between physical healing and spiritual healing. Sometimes it's not God's will to heal someone physically. But, it's always God's will to spiritually heal someone

who comes to Him in repentance and faith. This means that we can confidently say to God, 'I know you are willing, make me clean from my

The healing for sin that comes through Jesus is instant, and complete

John says, "the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). If we don't seek this spiritual healing, our sins will not be not be forgiven, so we will have to be punished for them for all eternity in that awful place which Scripture calls hell.

If you began to experience serious chest pains you would contact your doctor immediately because you would be concerned about your physical health. But, if you are not trusting in Jesus you have an even more serious and urgent problem. I would urge you to be concerned about your spiritual health.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF STRABANE ROYAL BLACK DISTRICT CHAPTER No.2 ... 150 YEARS AND STILL GOING STRONG

he District Chapter of Strabane was formed in 1864 upon receipt of a warrant issued by the Imperial Grand Black Chapter. In 1865, Killyman, Aughnacloy and Strabane District Chapters met to form County Tyrone Grand Black Chapter.

In 1876, the District comprised of 13 preceptories with the present six member preceptories together from 1908 onwards. Killyclooney RBP No.64 is the only original preceptory still in existence, being formed in 1856.

Early records are scarce, but minutes exist from 1943 onwards. These show five Wor. Masters in that time with the most prominent being Sir Knight RF Cummings who served for more than 30 years, Sir Knight Irwin Craig, 13 years and the present Sir Knight Ian Donnell, 23 years.

Membership in early years was low. However, after the Second World War, this started to increase. Donemana RBP 260 showed great improvements under the leadership of Sir Knight Irwin Craig. Artigarvan RBP 91 and Strabane RBP 184 had some political figures in their ranks. Numbers were around 250-270 in the decades from the 1950s to the early 1970s – however, this has gradually declined to the present 160 mark.

In the early 1900s the district used to demonstrate with the Apprentice Boys of Derry on 12th August in Londonderry. After the war years, records show the Chapter demonstrating on the 'Last Saturday' with the Sir Knights of Tyrone. Recent North Tyrone Demonstrations are hosted in Donemana as republican elements have ensured

that the last Strabane Demonstration was held in 1982 and the last traditional morning parade of Strabane was in 1996.

The 'Toubles' also affected the Chapter with some preceptories losing esteemed Sir Knights to terrorist murder and associated families suffering as a result of terrorism. Most Wor. Sir Knight James Molyneaux, Sovereign Grand Master, reported to Grand Council in June 1972 that "Sir Knight Senator John EN Barnhill was murdered in a bestial manner by terrorist gunmen in his own home at Brickfield, Strabane, a few days after attending Grand Council in December 1971." He had been Strabane District Registrar for 22 years.

Throughout these past 150 years, Sir Knights from this District Chapter have proudly served this great Institution in various offices at County and Imperial levels. Generations of the Cummings family (RBP 91) have served as Grand Treasurers for County Tyrone with Sir Knight Rev. T A H Moriarty and Sir Knight Rev. Frank M Hay (both RBP 91) giving excellent service to the chaplaincy of County Tyrone.

Though presently the smallest District Chapter in County Tyrone, we continue to enjoy tremendous support and encouragement from our County Officers and the Sovereign Grand Master. On this 150th Anniversary we celebrate our past heritage and look forward, rededicating ourselves to the Lord Jesus Christ as our Saviour and Deliverer, ever advancing the Protestant Reformed faith and upholding the Royal Black Institution.


